

FORT LAUDERDALE-HOLLYWOOD INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Deputy Director of Aviation

The Broward County, Florida - Aviation Department which manages Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport (FLL) and North Perry Airport (HWO), its general aviation facility, seeks a dynamic, results oriented, senior level professional to serve as Deputy Director. This is a key management position overseeing the activities of the entire department with particular emphasis on the Operations and Maintenance areas. The selected individual will assist the Director of Aviation in administering the County's aviation program insuring proper coordination, performance against budget, and compliance with policies and appropriate priorities.; directing through subordinates the planning, scheduling, and coordination of Departmental activities; developing policies, procedures and priorities to meet established goals and must represent the department with a high degree of integrity and credibility.

Broward County has a population of 1.8 million citizens. The County has a charter form of government with a nine-member Board of County Commissioners elected by single member Districts for four-year staggered terms, with a three-term maximum limit. The Mayor and Vice Mayor are elected by their peers to serve one-year terms. The Commission appoints the County Administrator who serves as the Chief Executive Officer directing the day to day functions of the operating department directors which includes the Aviation Department (BCAD).

The Aviation Department serves over 331,000 aircraft operations and has total passenger traffic in excess of 22.7 million annually. BCAD functions with a \$150.9 million operating budget and capital budget in excess of \$380 million. Over \$1 billion in capital improvements are scheduled for completion prior to 2015. The Department has made a significant commitment to quality customer services and has invested heavily in environmental protection programs. BCAD employs 484 personnel, who are all employees of Broward County. Over 12,000 jobs are directly associated with FLL and HWO.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with major course work in business administration or aviation management or related field; six (6) years progressive experience in aviation management at a major airport including four (4) years high level supervisory and a wide variety of executive level Airport operation and administrative experience; or any equivalent combination of relevant training and experience.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: Candidates possessing an advanced related degree, AAE, demonstrated excellent oral and written communications skills and superior leadership skills are strongly preferred.

NOTE: Applicants selected for employment with the Aviation Department will be subject to extensive security screening, including but not limited to fingerprint checks, employment verification, and such other procedures as may be mandated by Federal Law as a continuing condition of employment.

The Aviation Department operates under a Drug-Free Workplace Policy in compliance with the provisions of the Federal Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988. A valid Florida driver's license is required and the successful applicant must be able to obtain and maintain federally mandated security clearances for working at an airport.
