1:00 PM – 5:00 PM	<p>Optional Global Reporting Initiative Sustainability Reporting Workshop</p> <p>Sustainability has been described by the Harvard Business Review as the next emerging “business mega trend.” Already 10% of the companies by value trading on the New York Stock Exchange now report on Sustainability/Corporate Social Responsibility. The most commonly followed reporting guidelines are the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) G3 Guidelines.</p> <p>10 international airports are currently working with a diverse stakeholder group to develop an airport sector supplement to the GRI G3 guidelines. The supplement is anticipated to be out for a 90-day public comment period beginning in late July 2010. This workshop is intended to provide information to interested ACI-NA members about sustainability reporting in general, the GRI airport sector supplement development process, GRI sustainability reporting framework, the G3 guidelines, and the supplement content out for public comment. The supplement will be finalized and available for industry use in early 2011.</p> <p>The presenters include the North America airport representatives participating in the stakeholder group – Matt Harris (San Diego), Phil Ralston (Portland, OR), Randy McGill (Toronto), and Janell Barrilleaux (Denver). The workshop is not intended to include discussions about why an airport should participate in GRI or to defend or justify what the working group has developed; but rather to provide an educational session on the GRI framework and specific content of the supplement so that airports can provide constructive feedback on the instrument and can make educated decisions/recommendations within their own organizations about sustainability reporting in general.</p> <p>Participants will be expected to spend time in advance of the workshop becoming familiar with the G3 guidelines and GRI reporting framework. Documents can be accessed through the GRI website at http://www.globalreporting.org/. This is imperative because we will focus much of the workshop on the airport supplement.
